

# Arkansas Academy of Mechanical Engineering (AAME) Summer Board Meeting Minutes August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023

### CALL TO ORDER AND OPENING STATE OF THE ORGANIZATION REMARKS

The Summer Board Meeting of the Arkansas Academy of Mechanical Engineering was called to order at 10:04 a.m. CDT on Friday, August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023, by President Mike Anderson.

### **APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES**

Secretary Pete Opper submitted minutes from the April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023 Annual Business Meeting for approval, which had been emailed to membership by Melynda. Secretary Opper said he would update a couple of incorrect dates and an incorrect title, but nothing significant. It was motioned to approve the minutes with those changes, the motion was seconded, and the board voted to approve.

### TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer Jeff Hayes started by presenting the General Accounts report. In the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter, we had substantial contributions of \$125,787 and \$31,893 in expenses. Banquet costs of \$26,801 were the largest part of expenses. Fiscal year 2023 began on July 1, 2022, and our beginning balance was \$214,109. We ended the fiscal year with a balance of \$317,328. ### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

### **✓** Finance Committee Report

Chairman Rob Porbeck presented the finance report. Chairman Porbeck said that our total contributions for the fiscal year were over \$152,000. For expenses, we had \$15,000 in scholarships and the banquet was \$26,801 which summed to the bulk of our expenditures. Our total assets are \$654,978, which is about \$108,000 more than the end of fiscal year 2022. About 27% of our members are contributing. Chairman Porbeck proposed a budget for Fiscal Year 2024, which he said was based on the last several budgets with about 5% added to some of the categories. The proposed budget estimated total income at \$62,500. For expenses, he proposed to bump up general scholarships from \$15,000 to \$20,000 for the year and to leave special projects at \$10,000. The 2024 banquet is budgeted at \$28,000. This resulted in a total expense budget of \$58,000, with an estimated budget surplus of \$4,500. Treasurer Hayes said he thought it was a good budget and asked Dr. Nutter if he thought the special project amount seemed appropriate. Dr. Nutter said yes, and he said it would be used for student activities such as senior design projects and not for equipment purchases. There was a motion to approve, Cristine Wolf 2nded, and the board voted to approve the budget. The FY2023 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Finance Report and the new FY2024 budget are excerpted below. FY2022 finances are shown for comparison.



### ✓ Fundraising Committee

Chairwoman Wolf said that there was no news on fundraising other than the last year of scholarship contributions was really good. Bob Harrison has said he wants to take fundraising over so Cristine is planning to stop chairing fundraising when he's ready.

### ✓ Membership Committee Report

Chairwoman Katrenia Taweel said that the deadline for nominations for 2024 inductees is September 1, 2023. We currently have two nominations. Cristine Wolf said that the by-laws require the inductee certification meeting to be held between September 10<sup>th</sup> and October 15<sup>th</sup>. President Anderson mentioned that we are also in need of a member to take over the membership committee next year when Chairwoman Taweel takes over the Presidency.

### ✓ Student Liaison Committee

President Anderson said that we are still looking for a student liaison committee chairperson. Please reach out to him if you're interested. Dr. Nutter said that one of the main activities of this committee is offering resume reviews and mock interview conversations to students prior to the career fair. We can do a combination of inperson and remote resume reviews. Cristine Wolf said that we might consider sending a letter to membership soliciting a new student liaison chair. Darren Talley said that he is more than happy to help someone transition into the position. September 27<sup>th</sup> is the fall career fair, so resume reviews will need to happen before then.

#### MECHANICAL ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT UPDATE

Dr. Nutter provided the status for the M.E. Department. He said that around 32,000 students are enrolled for fall and it's possible that that next year's enrollment may be as high as 34,000. College of Engineering enrollment is flat, but the numbers are still strong. We have the largest incoming sophomore ME class ever. The ME Senior class was small due to COVID and the new sophomore and junior classes are large. We're excited about the two new faculty members who are getting started, and we're hiring one more faculty member in controls and robotics, bringing total ME staff to 24. Lots of construction is going on around campus, along with some renovations in the ME Building. We have some new furniture and a new name for the library, which will now be called the Mechanical Engineering Focus Room. The foyer has been modernized with new static displays and some new monitors that will provide information, such as stories about students and AAME scholarship recipients. Downstairs we have a space for studying and snacking that students have been asking for. We've added our first CNC lathe, as well as a new industrial size 3-D printer. We've beefed up manufacturing content in lab classes, our faculty are creating modules where every student has hands on exposure to manufacturing, and we hope this will make them better designers. Lastly, in mid-October, The College of Engineering Development Group will hold a 2-day giving drive to reach out to recent alumni. They will be asking for small donations to the scholarship fund to try to connect with those that haven't been in touch for a while. The ME department will be reaching out to board members as to how to engage with alumni for ABET renewal. Bill Hart commented that the M.E. facility improvements sound exciting.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

1. 2023 Banquet Review – President Anderson thanked Melynda for the great job she and her team did preparing for and setting up the 2023 banquet and especially for the meal that was provided. He asked if there were any comments or requests for next year. Melynda said that we might want to extend the cocktail time if we only have two inductees next year. Cristine Wolf asked if we could have one or two students speak again. There was some discussion regarding adding a lecture, but some members recollected that several years ago we had lectures and a lot of the spouses did not seem to enjoy them.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

1. President Anderson opened up the floor. There was some discussion regarding that we only have two nominees for next year. We've had up years and down years, but need to continue to try to recruit members. Kyle Johnson said that students that are mentored by AAME members may be more likely to join in the future. He has two mentees right now, and he said that it's been mutually beneficial.

### **CONCLUSION**

The next meeting is planned for on or about Friday, October 13th. President Mike Anderson adjourned the meeting.
