CALL TO ORDER AND OPENING STATE OF THE ORGANIZATION REMARKS

The Fall Board Meeting of the Arkansas Academy of Mechanical Engineering was called to order at 12:05 p.m. CDT on Friday, October 14th, 2022, by President Cristine Wolf. President Wolf confirmed that there was a quorum of directors in attendance which would be required for voting to certify the new membership candidates for election.

APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES

Secretary Pete Opper submitted minutes from the July 15th, 2022 Summer Meeting for approval, which had been emailed to membership by Melynda. Secretary Opper said that he had corrected the heading over the finance charts to list them as being for the "4th quarter". Bob Harrison motioned to approve, Jack Helms seconded and the Board approved the minutes.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer Jeff Hayes presented the Treasurer's Reports for the FY2023 1st quarter ending on September 30th. Starting with the General Accounts Report, Treasurer Hayes said that we had \$675 in contributions, we received \$147 back from the banquet and we transferred \$786 into scholarship spending. The low income amount is aligned with what's typical for the first quarter. Our investments lost \$5146, which seems reasonable given recent market conditions, and we ended up with a balance of \$209,029 in the General Account. The General Accounts Report is shown below.

Moving on to the Scholarship Report, Treasurer Hayes said that we transferred \$785 into Scholarship Spending to finish covering fall scholarships. There were \$6,500 in scholarships funded, one for \$1000, and the remaining for \$500 each. Investment losses were at \$10,522, more than the General Account losses because the Scholarship Accounts balance is much higher. Note that our spending account is at zero balance which is normal. The Scholarship Accounts Report is shown below.

✓ Finance Committee Report

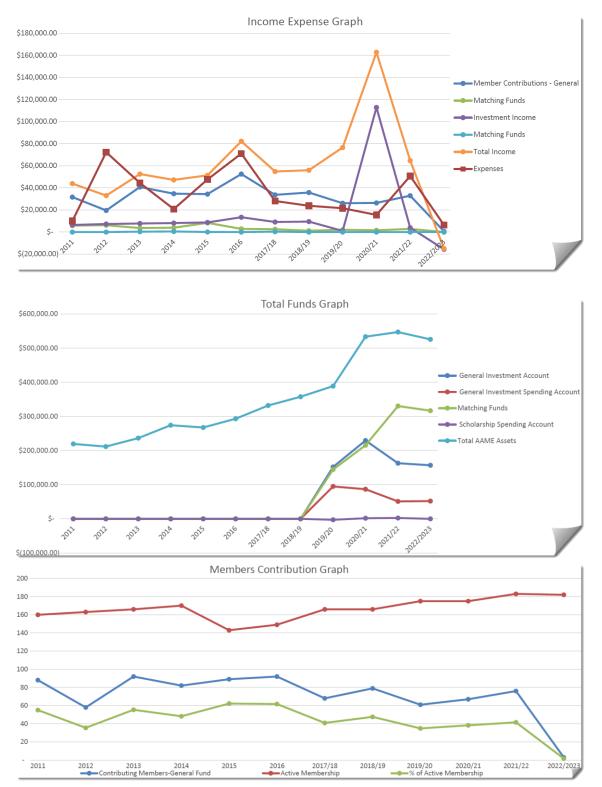
Chairman Robert Porbeck was unavailable and Treasurer Hayes presented the Finance Report in his absence. Only 3 members contributed of the 182 members on the roster. There was some discussion about how the scholarship budget has been increased, yet the additional funds have not yet been utilized for fall scholarships. Treasure Hayes said he would check with Melynda on this. Total AAME funds are at \$525,688, which reflects a sizeable increase from a few years ago. The candidate ballot email will remind members to contribute so hopefully we'll have better contributions in the 2nd quarter. ✓ Awards Committee

Chairman Mike Anderson said that we are working on awards for the spring banquet and there was nothing else to report.

✓ Conduct, By-Laws & Constitution Committee Report

Chairman Zane Boatright was not available, but had told President Wolf that he had nothing to report. President Wolf said that we have 182 active members and our by-laws currently cap membership at 200. If we induct all our candidate inductees, we will exceed this cap. President Wolf proposed to increase this to 250, based on the increased size of the student body and the expectation of having more qualified members for induction. President Wolf asked for Board input for this proposal. Discussion followed, including comments that there was still a limit of 10 new members each year. This proposed By-Laws change will require a vote at a future meeting.

✓ Fundraising Committee

President Wolf will continue to act as fundraising chair while Chairman Bob Harrison is unavailable.

✓ Membership Committee Report

Chairwoman Katrenia Taweel reported that there are nine nominations for new regular members and one nomination for an associate member that will be voted on by the Directors for putting up for election by membership.

✓ Student Liaison Committee

Chairman Darren Talley said we had 10 volunteers for 20 students for resume reviews. Several mentorships have started. Chairman Talley said that he planned to follow-up and verify that all the connections have been made. President Wolf thanked Chairman Talley and said she is proud that this has continued.

MECHANICAL ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT UPDATE

Dr. Nutter provided the status for the M.E. Department. He started by thanking Darren Talley for organizing the mentoring program and also announcing that Chairman Talley would be teaching a nuclear reactor design class in the spring. Total fall enrollment at the University is about 31,000, the College of Engineering is almost 4300, and Mechanical Engineering is slightly down at 527. The sophomore and junior M.E. class sizes are up 10%. We are grateful to see an increase in student engagement and class attendance, it's looking like we are coming out

of the COVID era disengagement, while there are still some issues, things are much improved. Every seven years, the department goes through a graduate program review. The final report is not complete, but initial feedback is very positive. The University Chancellor selection is pending, there are talks regarding merging the electrical, computer science and computer engineering departments. Mechanical Engineering is in process of hiring three faculty members, one for robotics and controls automation, one for design and manufacturing, and the third for next generation transportation systems. On a sad note, an undergrad M.E. student has recently passed away. Dr. Nutter met with the student's parents, and he feels that the department was able to provide a small amount of comfort letting them know the impact the student made, and that he will be awarded a posthumous degree in the spring. Two new offices have been created downstairs, and a third location is still in work for the new faculty.

OLD BUSINESS
